Prosecutes felony level family violence cases which
includes physical child abuse, felony domestic violence,
vulnerable adult abuse and neglect which occur in
private homes. The division is staffed with Attorney's,
licensed social workers, investigators and victim advocates
providing referrals and on-going support for the victim
during the prosecution of the case.

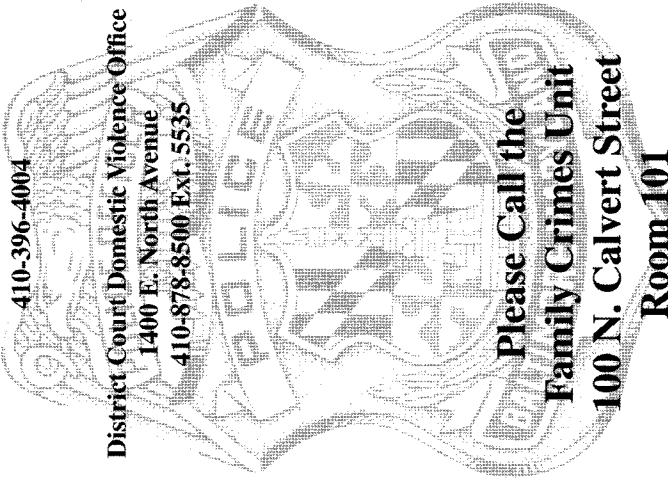
