

Performance to Feature Roland Park Dancers

Baltimore's Full Circle Dance Company will present ***Aqueous: Awakening Our Connections to Water*** on February 27 at 2:30 and 7:30 at the Baltimore Museum of Art.

The show features work by five different choreographers, each creating a different dance about water. The dances are dynamic and varied, addressing such themes as conservation, water in myth and legend, water as a symbol of spiritual purification, and watery landscapes as a source of inspiration for art.

The February 27 matinee performance will feature a guest appearance by 19 students of our own Roland Park Elementary School who have collaborated with Full Circle to create a dance about the Chesapeake Bay. The student dance is choreographed by RP resident Liz Pelton. Please come and support our student dancers and the local professional company that donates time to our public school. (The February 27 evening performance will not feature students but will include a wonderful guest performance by American Indians of Maryland.)
