### **1. Deadline for Tickets to Community Foundation Spring Fling.**

### **2. "One Plus One" Presentations.**

The city Department of Public Works is scheduling citywide community meetings to inform city residents about proposed changes to improve household waste services, including a presentation on the advantages of "One Plus One" waste collection followed by a question-and-answer session. ### **4. Attention, Dog Walkers!**

Be advised that recently city animal-control officials issued a triple citation to a Roland Park resident for allowing three dogs to walk off leash in Stony Run Park. Fines start at \$100 per dog and can go up to \$1,000 for repeat offenses. The city code regulation is as follows:

#### **§ 10-307. Restraints required.**

(a) *In general.*

All animals must be restrained:

- (1) as required by this section; and
- (2) in the case of a dangerous animal, as required by § 10-602 of this title.

(b) *Dogs.*

All dogs must be kept:

- (1) confined in a building or secure enclosure; or
- (2) secured by a leash or otherwise.
