### **3. Baltimore Green Map's "Map Global."**

On June 5 from 5:30 to 8:30pm, Baltimore Green Map is hosting "Map Global. Celebrate Local!" at the Conservatory in Druid Hill Park.

Baltimore Green Map is part of the international festivities celebrating the launch of Open Green Map worldwide. There are events planned in many Green Mapped cities — NYC, Stockholm, Santiago, Geneva, Jakarta, Capetown, Clackmannanshire — all to be linked by slideshow and Twitter into one global community fest.

The Friends of Druid Hill Park are our co-hosts for this event which will include map displays and interactive demonstrations, music, light refreshments and, of course, opportunities to add sites to Baltimore's Green Map. (We thank Dogwood, Gertrude's, Golden West, Whole Foods, Zia's Cafe, Clipper City and Woodhall Winery for their contributions to the festivities.)

Baltimore is in the forefront of this international Green Map movement, having produced the much-lauded Jones Falls Trail print map including a detailed map of Druid Hill Park (viewable at [www.baltogreenmap.org/maps.shtml](http://www.baltogreenmap.org/maps.shtml)) and the online, interactive Baltimore Regional Green Map, already showing over 300 local resource sites to the world (<http://www.opengreenmap.org/baltimoreregion>).

Roland Park Elementary/Middle School is on the map as a Green School as are many other places familiar to RPEMS families, plus others you may not know. The online map is a social media site — you can make comments, add images, suggest new resources to add. More than 500 places around the world have used the award-winning Green Map Icons to map their nature, culture and sustainable living resources. Open Green Map, a Google-based application, will make sustainability mapping accessible to many more.
